Read 1 John 4:7-8 (NRSV)

⁷ Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love.

Therefore since we know that love comes from God the answer to “how to love” is very simple. We must first let God pour out His love into us so that we can pour out that same love to others. In order for us to give anything we must first receive. Jesus said to his disciples, “Freely you have received. Freely Give” (Matthew 10:8 NASB)

Once we allow God to pour Himself into us it’s so easy to love people! Serving people no longer becomes a burden but a true joy! It’s the most edifying thing in the world and nothing takes the place of it. The way to open your heart to receive the love of God deep into your heart is through prayer and studying the Word for the purpose of knowing God, not to memorize Scripture to brag because “love does not brag and is not arrogant” 1 Corinthians 13:4 (NASB).

Live

Jesus tells you, “Let not your heart be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in Me” (John 14:1 NKJV)

When we study Scripture to know God we start to become like Him. We have to understand love more so that we can visually see if what we are giving is genuine love.

For example, you may say “I love people” and that’s awesome! But have you ever been offended by what they have done, maybe so much so that you even lost your temper?

1 Corinthians 13:5 says love “is not provoked...”

5. When you see someone in the hallway do you remember the wrong things they did to you in the past? Share and Discuss.

1 Corinthians 13:5 also says love “...does not take into account a wrong suffered...” meaning if you truly love people, how can they ever make you angry or move you to bitterness toward them?

Honestly speaking—that seems a little impossible doesn’t it?

The truth is that it is truly impossible if you are trying to do this on your own. This is where the power of God can bring a transformation of your heart and motives.

Jesus said “*Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing.*” (John 15:4-6 NASB)

6. Do you notice the emphasis Jesus makes on the fact that we cannot do anything without first abiding in Him? Discuss.

It means in order for us to truly live a life of love we *have* to rely on Jesus. No branch can bear fruit by itself unless that branch (us) abides in the vine (Him).

How do you “abide in the vine?” The way this is accomplished is by going into your room and hushing your soul and simply saying, “Lord I want to abide in you.” When you reach this place of intimacy (which is for everyone) where you become so engulfed in His presence – no one can provoke you or cause you to be offended because you are called to them – they are not called to you.

It’s not about what someone can do for you either because God already gave you everything in Christ. Now it’s just about loving people with the same love and sincerity Christ has for you. But you’ll never truly know it unless you abide in Him through prayer and reading of the Word.
